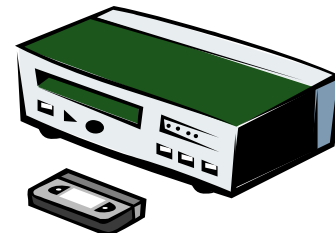
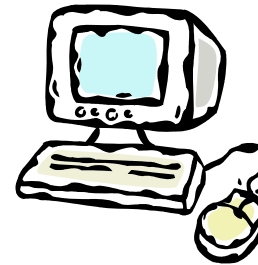




ELECTRONICS RECYCLING INFORMATION

Effective January 1, 2012, the Illinois Electronics Products Recycling and Reuse Act bans the following items from being landfilled:

- Computers – Desktops, Notebooks, Netbooks, & Tablets
- Computer Monitors
- Printers
- Televisions
- Electronic Keyboards
- Facsimile Machines
- Video Cassette Recorders
- Portable Digital Music Players
- Digital Video Disc Players
- Video Game Consoles
- Electronic Mice
- Scanners
- Digital Converter Boxes
- Cable Receivers
- Satellite Receivers
- Digital Video Disc Recorders
- Small Scale Servers
