Homes for a Changing Region

Homes for a Changing Region (Homes) is a project of the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP)'s Local Technical Assistance (LTA) program, in partnership with the Metropolitan Mayors Caucus (MMC) and with support from the Metropolitan Planning Council (MPC).

Homes assists municipal leaders in charting the future demand and supply trends for housing in their communities, and developing long-term housing policy plans aimed at creating a balanced mix of housing types, serve the needs of current and future residents and workers, and enhance the livability of participating communities.

Arlington Heights is participating in the *Homes* process with its neighboring communities of Mount Prospect, Buffalo Grove, Palatine, and Rolling Meadows.

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Homes public workshops were held in the five participating northwest suburbs. The Arlington Height public workshop was held on June 19, 2012.

Residents participated in a visual preference survey. The results of the Arlington Heights visual preference survey follow.

The visual preference survey questions were divided into three groups:

Demographic Questions meant to help the project team determine which of the Village's various demographic groups were represented at the workshop.

Residential Preference Questions asking the participants to characterize the type of housing in which they live, might live in the future and where they think elderly and young residents live.

Visual Preference Questions to determine the types and styles of housing preferred by residents for the community.






E. In your next move, what type of housing do you see yourself living in?
